Have someone read one (or all) of these verses. (2 Timothy 3:16-17, Colossians 1:9-12 and James 1:22-25)

Discuss it!

- How does this story point back to Jesus?
- What caused Saul to change? Remind kids that Saul did nothing in his own power to change. Discuss how Jesus changed Saul and even though he became physically blind, he truly was able to see and believe who Jesus is. Lead kids to remember that we are never too sinful for Jesus to save us. Anyone who trusts in Jesus can be forgiven of their sins and be right with God.

ENGAGE THE HEART

Have someone read one (or all) of these verses. (John 15:4, James 5:16, 1 John 1:5-10, 1 John 1:9)

- How do you need God's help this week?
- Is there any sin we need to confess to Jesus and ask Him to forgive us?

REVIEW THE MISSION

Have someone read one (or all) of these verses! (John 20:21 and 2 Corinthians 5:18-20)

- Who is someone who needs God's love and how can we show it to them?

Want Family Mission Ideas? Here is one that relates to this week's lesson!

- Parents, take time to share your testimony with the family this week. Think about how you can describe how your life changed in meeting Jesus. If kids have professed faith in Christ, allow them to share their testimony with the family as well. You might even consider sharing videos from other family members, such as grandparents, aunts, and uncles.

PRAY TOGETHER

Pray together as a family. You can pray short prayers like, "God, thank you for" or "God, help me with" or "God, I'm sorry for..."

In light of our lesson, ask God to help you know Jesus personally. What's the difference between knowing Jesus and knowing about Jesus? How can we truly know Jesus?
